# 2024 Parks and Open Space Plan (POSP)

- In Washington state, park departments are required to develop Parks and Open Space Plans (POSPs) and submit them to the State Recreation and Conservation Office (RCO) to maintain eligibility for state grants and funding
- RCO requires plan adoption by City Council
- POSP objectives:
  - ✓ Document and describe parks, open spaces and facilities
  - ✓ Review changes in city demographics, recreation participation and projected demand
  - ✓ Define Level of Service standard
  - ✓ Coordinate with Office of Planning and Community Development and One Seattle Comprehensive Plan
  - ✓ Define near-term capital spending priorities



# POSP Approach & Public Engagement

- 2024 POSP is a “light update” (last plan completed in 2017)
- POSP and Seattle Park District planning periods were not in sync
- Public engagement for plan included:
  - ✓ Seattle Comprehensive Plan meetings in 2022/2023
  - ✓ SPR in-person meetings in 2023
  - ✓ Board of Parks and Recreation Commissioners public hearing and public comment period in early 2024

- March 14, 2024 POSP approved by Board of Parks and Recreation Commissioners
- March 27 Parks, Public Utilities and Technology Committee - briefing
- April 24 Parks, Public Utilities and Technology Committee - possible vote
- April 30 Full Council vote on POSP resolution
- May 1 POSP submission due to State RCO
