NOTABLE PROJECTS

Bike and Scoot Demo Day, Seattle

- Initially started as a Pilot project in partnership with the Seattle Department of Transportation,
 Commute Seattle now hosts Demo Day events as a regular summer/spring event. I'm responsible
 for the entire planning of the event to focus on educating the public about safe bike and escooter riding in the city. Partners with the 4 bike and scooter-share vendors of Seattle.
- I planned 6 Demo Day events in the last One and a half years, and have three more Demo Days coming up in the next month. More than 200 people have attended on an average. This event offers platform to engage with people about sidewalk rules, using the bike lanes, wearing helmets etc.,

Active Transportation Subsidy Research, Seattle

Certain employers in Seattle offer transportation subsides for employees using active
transportation mode, i.e. not driving alone to work. Extensive research on identifying the type of
subsidies, benefits, tracking methods, and of financial incentives administrations. The goal is to
understand the subsidies offered in the region. It is also be reference resource for other
employers who are looking to implement active transportation subsidy at their workplace.

Rainey Street Case Study, Austin

Undertook a case study on Austin's Historic District - Rainey Street to understand pedestrian activity and micro-mobility device usage in the street. The street becomes active in the evening to late night due to late night bars and restaurants. The case study was carried out to regulate traffic inflow into the street depending on the tome of the day and geo-fencing micro-mobility due to number of pedestrian injuries reported in that location.
