

SPU requests Ordinance Authority to:


- Provide ordinance authority to sell timber as surplus property from ecological thinning
- Conduct ecological thinning on 600 acres over 5 years in the Cedar River Municipal Watershed
- Deposit net revenue into the Water Fund

 People Served




Cedar River Watershed Habitat Conservation Plan

- Allows SPU to manage Cedar River water supply system
- Permits Incidental Take under Endangered Species Act
- Declares watershed as ecological reserve, prohibiting commercial timber harvesting



Watershed Forest Landscape

- City purchased land following timber harvest
- Forests are young and dense
 - has poor wildlife habitat
 - creates high wildfire hazard
 - has low resilience to climate impacts and disturbance





Forest Thinning with Ecological Objectives

- Reduce number of trees in dense second-growth forests
- Diversify forest canopy
- Select and plant rare tree and understory species



Benefits of Ecological Thinning Program


- Greater biodiversity
- Improved forest health and resilience
- Restored wildlife habitat
- Better water cycle regulation

Addresses key watershed goals:


- Hydrology

Cedar River Watershed Forest Management Plan


- Integrates new objectives
- Involves diverse stakeholders and Muckleshoot Indian Tribe in plan development
- Prioritizes management actions





Ecological Thinning Program

- Annual Program Cost:
 \$80,000 (Water Fund)
- Variable annual revenue from sale of timber as surplus property
- Thinning 600 acres in the 92,000-acre Cedar River Municipal Watershed





SPU requests Ordinance Authority to:

- Sell timber as surplus property from ecological thinning
- Sell up to 6 million board feet of timber from thinning over 5 years
- Deposit net revenue into the Water Fund to offset costs of implementing the Habitat Conservation Plan
