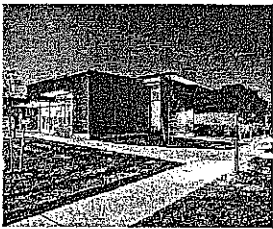

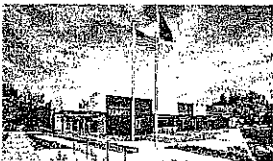
**Pike Place Market Waterfront Entrance** Seattle, WA *currently in design; targeting LEED Gold and ESDS*

This is a mixed use project on a steep slope site near the historic Pike Place Market. The program consists of a four story below-grade parking garage, commercial space, forty units of senior housing, and a public roof plaza. The project will be a critical link to Seattle's Waterfront project.



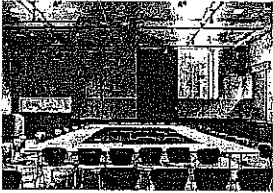
**Moses Lake Civic Center** Moses Lake, WA *2012 LEED Gold*

This 41,000 SF building combines public and cultural uses not typically found together: administrative offices for the City and the Parks Department's Museum and Art Center. Program elements include an exhibition gallery, classrooms, a council chamber, and a 200 seat sloped floor auditorium.



**Kirkland Justice Center** Kirkland, WA *2014 targeting LEED Silver*

This project is a conversion of an existing 100,000 SF "big box" warehouse building to a civic facility where the municipal courts and the expanded police department are co-located.



**Fort Vancouver Regional Library** Vancouver, WA *2011 LEED Gold*

This 75,000 SF Central Branch for the Fort Vancouver Regional Library significantly increases services and is a central facility in the community, tripling the previous space. The library provides indoor and outdoor meeting rooms and a presentation space for civic events.

This 70,000 SF science and technology building provides specialized teaching laboratories, lab support spaces, general classrooms and faculty offices. The main corridors provide places for students to meet in small groups for informal gatherings.

ADDS [Alcohol Drug Dependency Services] is a non-profit organization that offers a full range of chemical dependency treatment services. The Center is designed to house counseling and testing rooms, a community space, and offices for the administrative staff. Existing trees on site will be retained whenever possible. Part of Miller Hull's 1% program.



**Kenton Condominiums** Portland, OR *[unbuilt]*

The Kenton will be a 24-unit, transit-oriented, mixed-use residential condominium and retail development located in the revitalizing, historic Kenton neighborhood of North Portland. The project entails replacing a former site of crime and disinvestment with high quality, affordable, and sustainable units.
