

- *Position 2, 3 and 4: Two year terms**
- *Position 5,6, and 7: Three year terms*

Council appointments – initial terms

- *Position 8 (City employee): Seven years*
- *Position 9 and 10: Two year terms**
- *Position 11, 12, and 13: Three year terms*

*Subsequent appointees to the Oversight Committee shall each serve for a term expiring three years after the expiration of the initial term for the position.
