# **Capital Budget**

## House (\$1.3b)

- \$160 million toward affordable housing and the homeless crisis
- \$50 million in new early learning centers
- \$84 million in new treatment facilities
- \$670 million in Climate Commitment Act spending
  - Clean energy development
  - Grants to building owners for energy efficiency upgrades
  - Salmon recovery;
  - Carbon sequestration; and
  - Grants for clean air in public schools.

## **Senate (\$1.3b)**

- \$121.5 million in total K-12 school construction, maintenance, and improvement funding for districts
- \$60 million for new funding bucket to support skills center facilities for career and technical education
- \$44.5 million for the purchase and modernization of the Olympic Heritage Behavioral Health Hospital in Tukwila
- \$44.8 million for behavioral health and substance use disorder treatment facilities run by the state's partners in tribal government
- \$119 million in total housing funding, including \$111 million for the Housing Trust Fund.



# Operating Budget - House (\$71b)

- Low and moderate-income clean energy assistance: \$150 million
- Clean energy and climate programs \$63 million (CCA)
- Support for immigrants, refugees, asylees, and people who are undocumented: \$35 million
- Health care for uninsured adults: \$28 million
- Housing vulnerable populations, tenants' rights, and homeownership support: \$26 million
- Increased provider rates and reimbursements including basic foster care and ECEAP – \$26 million
- Increased childcare slots, expanded eligibility and technical assistance – \$13 million
- Special education, including increasing the cap to 17.25%
   \$35 million

- Increased need for local homeless services \$40 million
- Support to existing local housing programs to backfill the document recording fee – \$31 million
- Food assistance for seniors, summer EBT for kids, and food banks – \$73 million
- Additional support for refugees, asylees and newly arriving individuals – \$35 million
- Increased access to opioid use disorder treatment, programs, and supplies – \$151 million
- Increased state inpatient behavioral health capacity \$210 million
- Increased rates for long—term civil commitments in the community — \$47 million

## Operating Budget - Senate (\$71b)

- \$135.9 million to operate 72 beds at Olympic Heritage Behavioral Health
- \$20 million for the University of Washington Behavioral Health teaching hospital
- \$49.6 million for paraeducators
- \$13.5 million for special education
- \$19 million to establish a psychiatric residential treatment facility in Lake Burien for youth, aged 12-18, with complex needs

- \$36 million from the opioid settlement agreements will boost treatment for substance use disorder.
- \$242 million in new spending for K-12 schools, including funding for student meals, special education, and staffing needs, like paraeducators.

# **Transportation Budget**

## House (\$14.3b)

- \$150 million for fish passage barrier corrections.
- \$58 million for construction of five hybrid-electric ferries.
- \$24 million for ferry preservation/maintenance.
- \$340 million of additional revenue made possible by revenues from the carbon emission allowance auctions. Some of this additional funding will support Safe Routes to School and bicycle/pedestrian projects, electric school busses and the 2026 World Cup planning.
- \$66 million for traffic management, law enforcement, and the built environment to keep our streets and roadways safe.
- Due to escalated project costs, prioritizing construction of the North Bridge portion of 520/Portage Bay project. Construction of the south bridge and the Roanoke Lid will be pushed to future years.

## **Senate (\$14.6b)**

- \$150 million additional dollars into the preservation of roads, bridges and more statewide.
- \$31 million is invested in traffic safety measures, including \$13 million for the Washington State Patrol, \$5.5 million to combat impaired driving and \$1.3 million to help curtail speeding.
- \$150 million is included toward fish barrier removal to help expand the salmon population and restore river ecosystems.
- \$261 million all money from the Climate Commitment Act goes directly toward efforts to build new ferries and projects related to strengthening Washington's existing fleet.
- \$875 million for the I-5 Columbia River Bridge project
- \$52 million cost increase on the SR 520 Seattle Corridor Improvements – West End project. The total increase including later biennia is \$770 million. A \$140 million sales tax deferral and additional funds from future SR 520 segment tolling assists in accommodating the cost increase.



## **Budget & Revenue**

- HB 2044 (Duerr) Eliminates a nonsupplant restriction applicable to local government taxing districts located in a county with a population of 1.5 million or more (City supports)
- HB 2276 (Berg) Increases the "ceiling" for the Tier 1 1.1 percent state REET from \$525,000 to \$750,000. Imposes a new real estate transfer tax of 1 percent on the value of the selling price over \$3.025 million (City supports)
- HB 2375 (Geohner) Allows one detached accessory dwelling unit on properties that qualify for the senior citizen and disabled persons property tax exemption.

## **Climate & Environment**

- HB 1368 (Senn) Requires the Department of Ecology to administer the Zero-Emission School Bus Grant Program, and prioritize grants to routes serving communities highly impacted by air pollution and with buses manufactured prior to 2007. (City supports)
- HB 1976 (Fosse) Authorizes Commerce to provide higher incentives under the Early Adoption Incentive program for buildings that comply with the State Energy Performance Standard. (City supports)
- HB 1948 (Ybarra) Directs that a retail electric customers' voluntary renewable energy purchases do not count towards the overall calculation of that utility's load for the purposes of determining the utility's renewable energy targets under the Energy Independence Act. (City supports)

## **General Government**

- HB 1510 (Santos) Requires 30 percent of the sales tax revenue at qualified facilities to be deposited into the Community Preservation and Development Authority Account until January 1, 2036 (City supports)
- HB 1932 (Gregerson) Permits cities and towns to choose to hold their elections in even-numbered years instead of odd-numbered years.
- SB 6040 (Valdez) A prime contractor and each higher tier subcontractor must make payment within 10 days to its subcontractor until the subcontractor that is a small business certified or recognized as a women or minority owned business receives payment (City supports)

## **Healthcare & Behavioral Health**

- HB 2115 (Thai) Allows a health care provider who has prescribed an abortion medication to request that the prescription label for the medication include the prescribing and dispensing health care facility name, instead of the practitioner's name.
- HB 1929 (Cortes) Creates the Post-Inpatient Housing Program for Young Adults to provide supportive transitional housing with behavioral health supports for persons 18 to 24 years old who are exiting inpatient behavioral health treatment (City supports)
- SB 5853 (Dhingra) Authorizes 23-hour crisis relief centers to serve nonadult clients, and establishes guidelines for centers serving this population (City supports)
- SB 6095 (Robinson) Authorizes the Secretary of the Department of Health to issue a prescription or standing order to control and prevent the spread of, mitigate, or treat any disease or threat to public health (City supports)

## **Housing & Homelessness**

- HB 1054 (Walen) Prohibits an association of unit owners in a common interest community from regulating or limiting the number of unrelated persons that may occupy a unit.
- HB 1998 (Gregerson) Requires cities and counties to adopt ordinances, development regulations, zoning regulations or other official controls to allow co-living housing as a permitted use on any lot located within an urban growth area that allows at least six multifamily residential units (Passed 44-4)
- HB 2012 (Street) Expands the property tax exemption for nonprofit organizations providing rental housing or mobile home park spaces to qualifying households by allowing nonprofit organizations to receive funding from additional sources (City supports)
- HB 2114 (Alvarado) Limiting rent and fee increases, requiring notice of rent and fee increases, limiting fees and deposits, establishing a landlord resource center and associated services, authorizing tenant lease termination, creating parity between lease types, and providing for attorney general enforcement.
- HB 2160 (Reed) Establishes that cities may not enact or enforce any new development regulation within a station area that prohibits the siting of multifamily residential housing on parcels where other residential use is permissible and must allow new residential and mixed-use development within any station area at certain transit-oriented development densities (City supports)

## **Labor & Commerce**

- HB 1893 (Doglio) Allows individuals unemployed due to a labor strike to receive up to four weeks of unemployment insurance benefits following a specified disqualification period and the waiting week, provided that the labor strike is not found to be prohibited by federal or state law in a final judgment, in which case the disqualification resumes as of the date of the judgment.
- HB 2260 (Waters) Authorizes the Liquor and Cannabis Board to impose civil penalties on individuals for selling, gifting, or supplying liquor to anyone under the age of 21 from a business licensed by the LCB, and by a person employed by the business.

# **Public Safety & Criminal Justice**

- HB 2088 (Orwall) Extends liability protections for responders dispatched from mobile rapid response crisis teams and community-based crisis teams (City supports)
- SB 5424 (Lovick) Allows law enforcement agencies to adopt flexible work policies (City supports)
- SB 5427 (Valdez) Requires AG's office to oversee a hotline to assist people who have been targeted or affected by hate crimes and bias incidents and to publish annual reports regarding hate crimes and bias incidents (City supports)

## **Social Programs & Education**

- HB 2368 (Gregerson) Designates DSHS as the lead state agency responsible for the development, review, and administration of the Washington State plan for refugee settlement (City supports)
- HB 1945 (Alvarado) Streamlining and enhancing program access for persons eligible for food assistance (City supports)
- HB 1929 (Cortes) Creates the Post-Inpatient Housing Program for Young Adults to provide supportive transitional housing with behavioral health supports for persons 18 to 24 years old who are exiting inpatient behavioral health treatment (City supports)

## **Transportation**

- HB 1989 (Barkis) Creates the Graffiti Abatement and Reduction Pilot Program within the Department of Transportation (City supports)
- HB 1963 (Ramos) Requires that license plates must be uncovered.
- HB 2384 (Donaghy) Concerning automated traffic safety cameras (City supports)
