1. BILL SUMMARY

Legislation Title: AN ORDINANCE relating to the municipal water system of The City of Seattle; amending Ordinance 125714, as amended by Ordinance 126483, to incorporate the terms of certain contingent amendments thereto that were to become effective upon the occurrence of certain events that have since occurred, to delete certain provisions rendered inoperative by the amendments, and to make certain other technical amendments; and ratifying and confirming the amendments and certain prior acts.

Summary and Background of the Legislation: This legislation amends the Water System revenue bond "Omnibus Refunding Ordinance" that was passed by Council in Ordinance 125714 and amended by Ordinance 126483. Through the "Omnibus Refunding Ordinance" the City previously authorized the issuance of new water system revenue bonds for the purpose of refunding Outstanding Parity Bonds and outstanding loans of the Water System. However, the Omnibus Refunding Ordinance contained contingent amendments that have now become effective. For ease of reference and to avoid confusion going forward, this legislation amends sections of Ordinance 125714, as amended by Ordinance 126483, to read as shown in this legislation. This legislation incorporates the terms of the contingent amendments, deletes inoperative provisions, and makes other technical amendments consistent with subsection 24(a) of the Outstanding Parity Bond Ordinances.

Future Refunding Parity Bonds will be issued under the authority of this ordinance without affecting the outstanding bonds previously issued under the Omnibus Refunding Ordinance.
