1	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:
2	Section 1. Designation. Under Seattle Municipal Code (SMC) 25.12.660, the designation
3	by the Landmarks Preservation Board ("Board") of the improvement located at 1915 E Fir Street
4	and the site on which the improvement is located (which are collectively referred to as "Tolliver
5	Temple Church of God in Christ") is acknowledged.
6	A. Legal Description. Tolliver Temple Church of God in Christ is located on the property
7	legally described as:
8 9	Lots 9 and 10, Block 21 of H.L. Yesler's 1st Addition to the City of Seattle, according to plat recorded in volume 1 of plats, page 215, in King County, Washington.
10	B. Specific Features or Characteristics Designated. Under SMC 25.12.660.A.2, the Board
11	designated the following specific features or characteristics of Tolliver Temple Church of God in
12	Christ:
13	1. The site.
14	2. The exterior of the building.
15	3. The interior of the sanctuary.
16	4. Exempting all elements of the building and site that are liturgical in nature.
17	C. Basis of Designation. The designation was made because Tolliver Temple Church of
18	God in Christ is more than 25 years old; has significant character, interest, or value as a part of
19	the development, heritage, or cultural characteristics of the City, state, or nation; has integrity or
20	the ability to convey its significance; and satisfies the following SMC 25.12.350 provisions:
21	1. It is the location of, or is associated in a significant way with, an historic event
22	with a significant effect upon the community, City, state, or nation (SMC 25.12.350.A).

2. It is associated in a significant way with the life of a person important in the

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1	10) Installation, removal, or alteration of curbs, bollards, or				
2	wheelstops in parking areas.				
3	11) Signage in the rear parking area when not attached to the				
4	building.				
5	12) New structures in the rear parking area when there is a				
6	minimum of 15' between the historic building and the new structure.				
7	13) Installation of a 5-foot tall, black steel, vertical picket,				
8	perimeter fence with integrated pedestrian and vehicle gates, provided one can see through all				
9	components and no views of the building are obscured.				
10	c. Alterations or changes in appearance to the building exterior that				
11	include the following:				
12	1) Installation, removal, or alteration of signage for accessibility				
13	compliance; and other signage as required by City code. Sign locations will not obscure				
14	architectural features, and will be attached in a manner that is easily repairable. Fasteners must				
15	be located within joints when mounted on brick masonry.				
16	2) Installation or removal of interior, temporary window shading				
17	devices that are operable and do not obscure the glazing when in the open position.				
18	d. Alterations or changes in appearance to the sanctuary space that include				
19	the following:				
20	1) Removal and replacement of fixed seating in the sanctuary.				
21	2) Installation and replacement of movable (non-fixed) interior				
22	furnishings and equipment.				

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1	3) Installation, removal or alteration of interior artwork or display				
2	within the sanctuary, when attached to flat walls finished with plaster or gypsum wallboard.				
3	4) Replacement of carpet.				
4	5) Minor, general maintenance items that include small junction				
5	boxes or similar small devices and conduit when located in areas with low visibility.				
6	6) Alterations to the main speaking platform / pulpit and stairs, as				
7	long as the proscenium archway and associated architectural details are not changed.				
8	7) Alterations to or expansions of lower platforms on either side of				
9	the main speaking platform / pulpit and stairs, as long as the proscenium archway and associated				
10	architectural details are not changed.				
11	B. City Historic Preservation Officer (CHPO) Approval Process.				
12	1. The CHPO may review and approve alterations or significant changes to the				
13	features or characteristics listed in subsection 2.B.3 of this ordinance according to the following				
14	procedure:				
15	a. The owner shall submit to the CHPO a written request for the alterations				
16	or significant changes, including applicable drawings or specifications.				
17	b. If the CHPO, upon examination of submitted plans and specifications,				
18	determines that the alterations or significant changes are consistent with the purposes of SMC				
19	Chapter 25.12, the CHPO shall approve the alterations or significant changes without further				
20	action by the Board.				
21	2. If the CHPO does not approve the alterations or significant changes, the owner				
22	may submit revised materials to the CHPO, or apply to the Board for a Certificate of Approval				
23	under SMC Chapter 25.12. The CHPO shall transmit a written decision on the owner's request to				

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1	the public's safety, health, and welfare) to address hazardous conditions with adverse impacts to					
2	the buildings or site as related to a seismic or other unforeseen event. Following such an					
3	emergency, the owner shall adhere to the following:					
4	1) The owner shall immediately notify the City Historic					
5	Preservation Officer within 24 hours, and document the conditions and actions the owner took.					
6	2) If temporary structural supports are necessary, the owner shall					
7	make all reasonable efforts to prevent further damage to historic resources.					
8	3) The owner shall not remove historic building materials from the					
9	site as part of the emergency response.					
10	4) In consultation with the City Historic Preservation Officer and					
11	staff, the owner shall adopt and implement a long-term plan to address any damage through					
12	appropriate solutions.					
13	Section 3. Incentives. The following incentives are granted on the features or					
14	characteristics of Tolliver Temple Church of God in Christ that were designated by the Board for					
15	preservation:					
16	A. Uses not otherwise permitted in a zone may be authorized in a designated landmark by					
17	means of an administrative conditional use permit issued under SMC Title 23.					
18	B. Exceptions to certain of the requirements of the Seattle Building Code and the Seattle					
19	Energy Code, adopted by SMC Chapter 22.101, may be authorized according to the applicable					
20	provisions.					
21	C. Special tax valuation for historic preservation may be available under chapter 84.26 of					
22	the Revised Code of Washington (RCW) upon application and compliance with the requirements					
23	of that statute.
