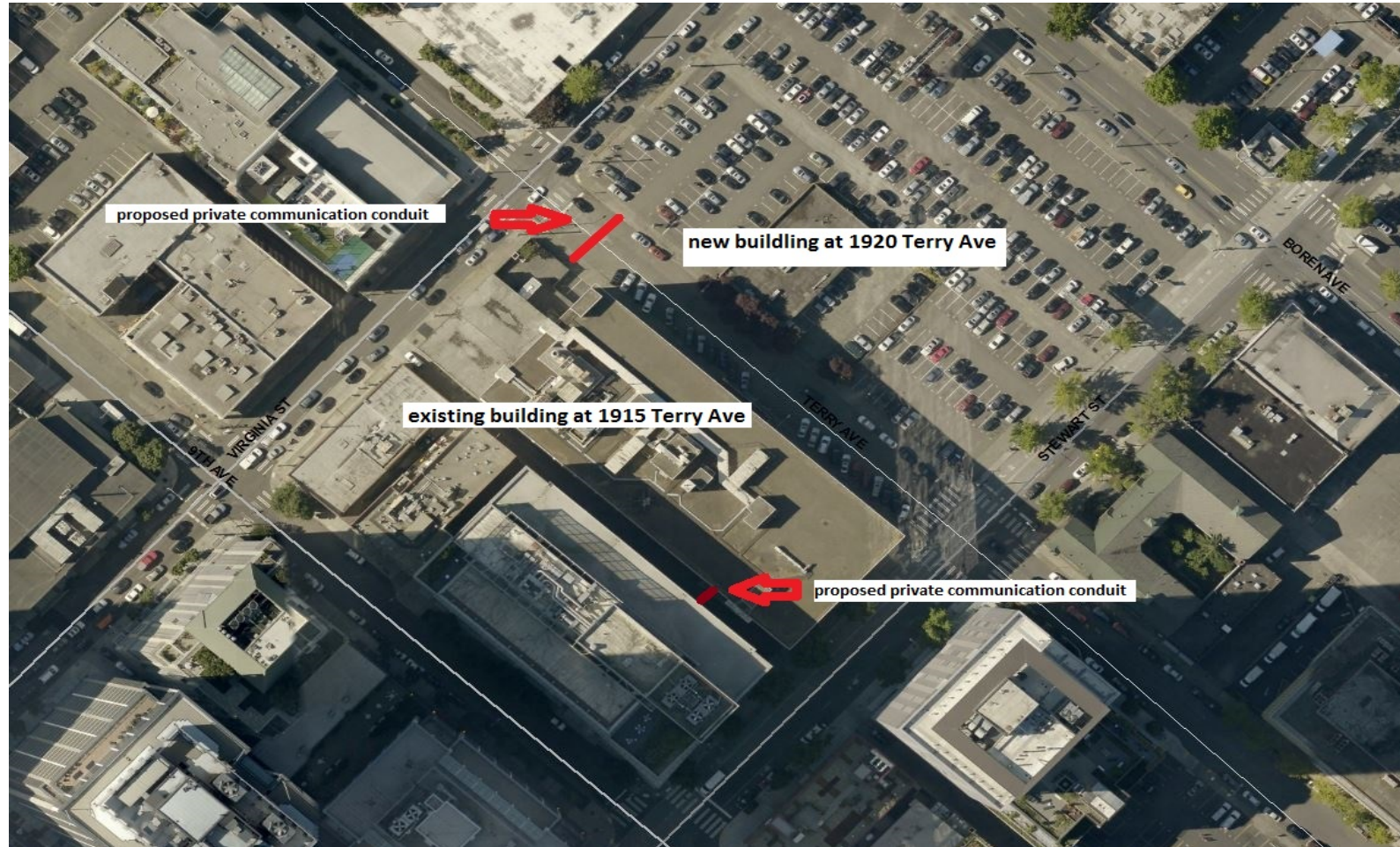

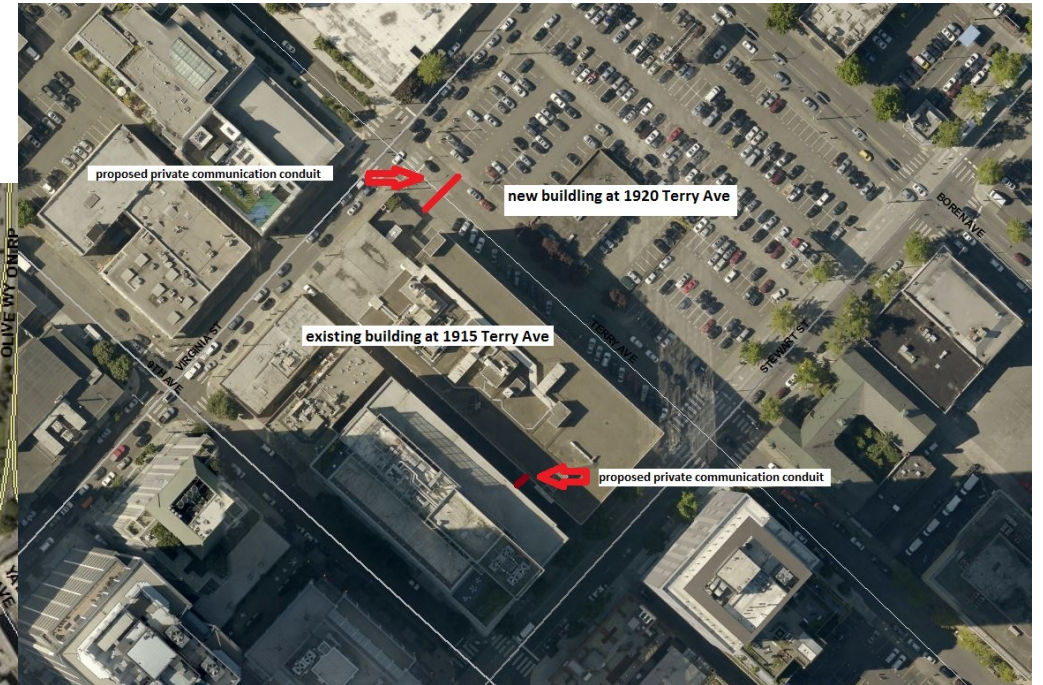
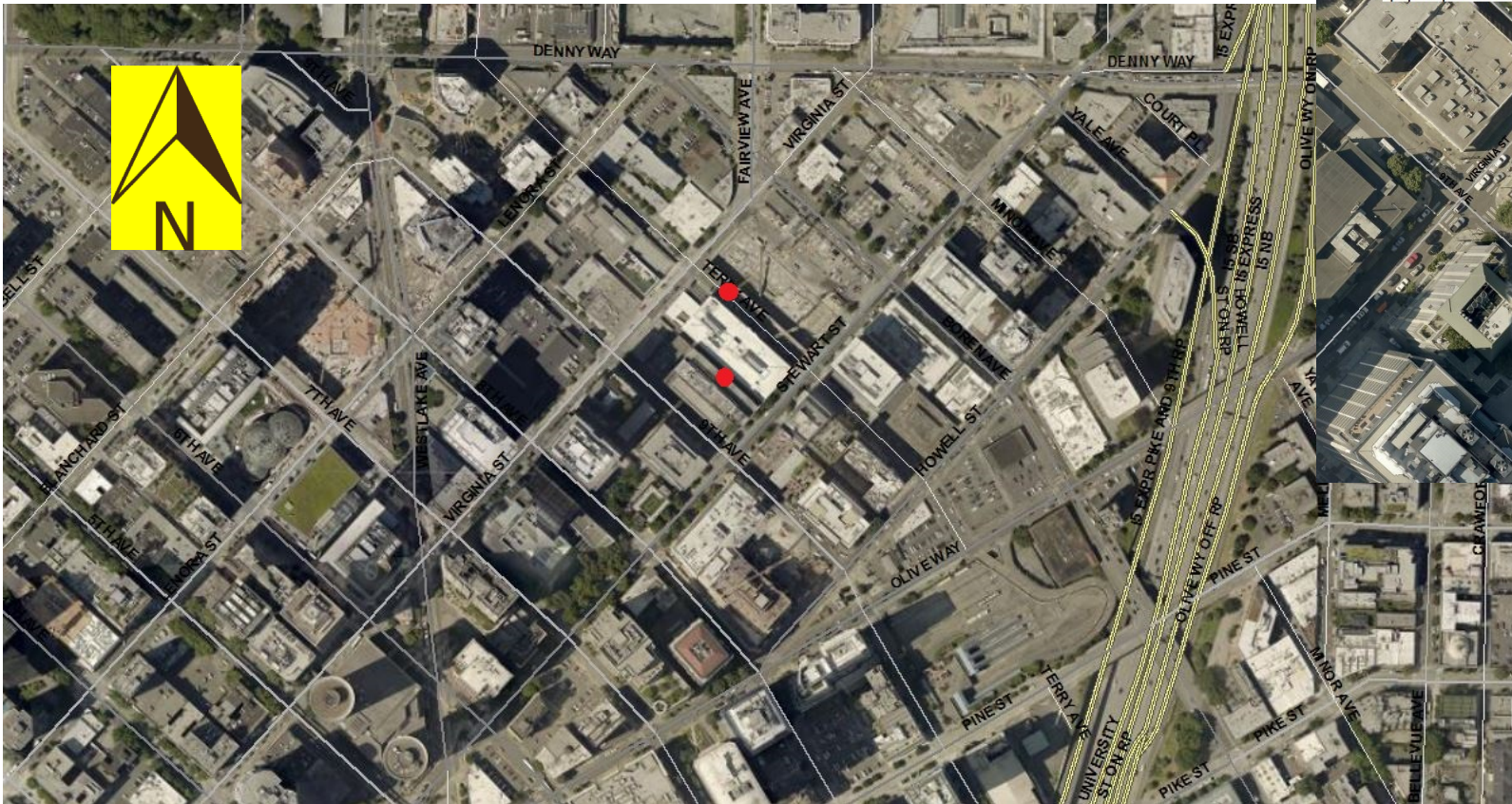
- Seattle Children's Research Institute is seeking a new permit for new private communication conduits under Terry Ave, south of Virginia St and north of Stewart St; and in the alley between Virginia St and Stewart St, north of 9th Ave and south of Terry Ave
- These communication conduits will allow sharing of data between the research facilities on research into cancer, lupus, and other children-related diseases
- SDOT recommends approval of the term permit ordinance
