CB 121226 Amendment Focus:

Impacts of Potential New/Expanded Revenue Sources

Section 4. If the King County Transportation Benefit District enacts a countywide transit funding measure, the City reserves the right to pass an ordinance that reduces the sales and use tax enacted pursuant to Section 1 of this ordinance and/or modifies the restrictions in Section 3 of this ordinance.

CB 121226: Overview

- Executive legislation, discussed in this committee on June 18
 - Presentation
 - Questions for Central Staff
- The bill would authorize the placement on the November ballot of the Seattle Transportation Measure (STM) Replacement
 - Seattle Transit Measure was a six-year, 0.15% tax passed by voters in 2020
 - \$50M+ per year primarily funds expanded King County Metro service
 - Revenue also supports Streetcar operations, transportation access programs, transit capital projects, and emerging mobility needs (e.g., West Seattle Bridge closure)
- CB 121226 proposes a ten-year, 0.3% tax, with annual revenue approximately \$138M
- Amendments will be discussed today, and the bill will be up for a vote on July 16
