As an individual with lived experience in foster care, I have valued expertise and passion for advocacy work using my voice in order to make a positive impact for those who have experienced the childhood welfare system. I have actively communicated with legislators through work with The Mockingbird Society, Treehouse for Kids and National Foster Youth Institute and continue to do so. I have a strong desire to continue legislative advocacy and public/motivational speaking throughout the rest of my career.

Work Experience

Treehouse Fellow, Treehouse for Kids, Seattle, WA, September 2022 - June 2023

- Assisted in developing Treehouse's North Star focus for services by providing lived experience perspective.
- Participated in group work with 8-15 individuals, facilitating discussions about a "storytelling bill of rights", which resulted in terms of media use and sliding scale for compensation development.
- Utilized strategic planning skills to distribute program resources efficiently and effectively.
- Planned, drafted and executed a speech for fundraising purposes, which funded programming for a nonprofit serving foster youth.
- Provided a lived experience lens during interviews with The Seattle Times,
 Ivanhoe, and RedElement Studios regarding experiences in foster care, childhood welfare programs and the effects of the system.
