- Transformed the agency's mission to provision of crime prevention and community building expertise to communities experiencing high levels of crime
- Established outcome and evaluation standards for agency programs
- Member of the Leadership team for 2013-2015 Department of Justice funded **Juvenile Hotspot** project in Southeast Seattle with partners Seattle Youth Violence Prevention Initiative, Seattle Police Department, George Mason University and community partners
- Member of the Leadership team for the 2013-2014 Seattle Police Department **Juvenile Hotspot** project in the West Precinct
- Leader of **Get Off the Streets (GOTS)** project in the Central Area which has reduced recidivism by providing treatment and housing to long-time addicted offenders
- Core Team member of Seattle's successful **Drug Market Initiative** diverting offenders involved in drug crimes to case managed services rather than jail or prison
- Increased community involvement in public safety problem solving
- Implemented Residential Rental Landlord Training to support crime-free rental housing
- Manage the Community Matching Grants for the **Seattle Youth Violence Prevention Initiative**
- Leader of the prevention component of the **Project Safe Neighborhoods** grant for the 2013-2015 project funded by the Department of Justice
- Member Seattle Police Chief Search committees 2014, 2010 and 1990
