6	exempting an unsustainably large portion of businesses in the PBIA from assessment,

8	WHEREAS, the City finds that businesses that qualify for the Business and Occupation Tax		
9	threshold exemption benefit from PBIA services to the same proportional degree as

6	operation, these businesses shall be assessed 50% of their assessment rate and 100%
7	during their third year of operation. This exemption does not apply to any assessment due
8	for the parking assessment in Zone C levied under subsection 2.1(f).
9	Section 2. A hearing shall be heard on this matter before the Government, Accountability,
10	and Economic Development Committee in the City Council Chambers, City Hall, 600 Fourth
11	Avenue, 2nd Floor, Seattle, Washington 98104 (enter on Fifth Avenue), on Thursday,
12	September 11, 2025, at 2:00 p.m., or as soon thereafter as the same may be heard. The City
13	Council will hear all protests and receive evidence for or against the proposed action.
14	Section 3. The City Clerk is requested to publish notice of this intention and of the
15	hearing in a newspaper of general circulation in Seattle and mail a complete copy to each
16	ratepayer within the proposed area, each at least ten days prior to the hearing.
