

<b>Background:</b> <p>As the Executive Director for Community Building and Inclusion at the University of Washington, <b>Dr. Marisa Herrera</b> has served in the Office of Minority Affairs and Diversity for 5 ½ years where she began in her role as the Director for the Kelly Ethnic Cultural Center and Theatre. She leads a unit that develops campus diversity programming in the areas of leadership, education on social justice, provides student leadership advisement and creates campus-wide diversity programs, new student cultural welcomes and oversees cultural graduations. As part of her role, she co-founded of Leadership Without Borders in 2014, a program and space geared towards supporting student development for undocumented student leaders. In addition to her Executive Director role, she is also an instructor in the UW College of Education, where she teaches a graduate course on marketing and finance in higher education.</p> <p>Originally from a small mining town in south eastern Arizona, Marisa received her doctor of education degree from the University of Southern California in Higher Education Administration.</p> <p>Marisa has served on several national advisory boards including the National Conference on Race and Ethnicity in Higher Education, the Association of Black Culture Centers as the Washington State Chair, College Board Native American Student Advocacy Institute, and the Washington State Coalition for Undocumented Students. Her local community involvement includes board member roles at the Center for Inclusive Entrepreneurship and she currently serves as Board Secretary for Casa Latina. In 2017 she was awarded the inaugural Evans School of Public Policy award for outstanding staff contributions to diversity and social justice called the "POC Voices and Visions Award" given by the Evans Students of Color Coalition. She was also recognized in 2015 by the NW Asian Weekly Newspaper's Women of Color Empowered Awards "Rising Star Award" and by UW Housing and Food Services Recognizing Outstanding UW Women.</p>
