Community Liaisons Program - A Brief History

Began as a City program within DON in 2009 to provide language assistance and event support for a major transportation project in Southeast Seattle.

The program was initially established as the Public Outreach & Engagement Liaisons (POEL) Program and operated under that name through the mid-2010s. During this period, POEL focused on building partnerships across City departments and supporting a wide range of smaller, short-term City projects and initiatives.

The program later evolved into the Community Liaisons (CL) Program and celebrated its 15th anniversary in 2024. Today, the CL Program continues to grow, with an expanded roster of active Community Liaisons and ongoing work agreements with City departments including HSD, SCL, SDOT, and SPU.

Their role is to ensure underrepresented groups have access to City information, resources, and decision-making power.

Community Liaisons Case Study: SCL Transportation Electrification Strategic Investment Plan Outreach

Project Summary: To help SCL to engage hard-to-reach language community members to develop community priorities for transportation electrification investment between 2025-2030.

Community Liaisons: A team of 12 CLs (Amharic, Arabic, Khmer, Korean, Lao, Mandarin, Oromo, Person with Disabilities, Somali, Spanish, Tagalog, and Vietnamese) conducted surveys, hosted focus groups, attended community outreach events, provided language services during electric car demonstrations and summarized engagement reports.

Impacts: Delivered 24 distinct language and cultural community engagements and spoke with 500+ SCL customers during the outreach process.

Community Liaisons Case Study: SPU Adopt A Street

Project Summary: SPU Adopt a Street is a grassroots litter removal program in Seattle that helps keep our streets clean.

Community Liaisons: Cantonese, Mandarin, Spanish, Somali, Amharic, Filipino, and Vietnamese liaisons engaged communities to encourage volunteer sign-ups in Lake City, University District, Columbia City, Delridge, Chinatown International District, South Park, and Rainier Beach.

Impacts:

- Liaisons helped collect program feedback, which later made the program more accessible, especially with hard-to-reach communities.
- Community Liaison efforts increased volunteer sign-ups by 1,000 community participants.

BIOGRAPHY OF BRYCE SEIDL

Bryce Seidl is a graduate of the University of California, Berkeley with a degree in ecology. He completed his MBA at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor with an emphasis on marketing. Upon graduation he joined the Simpson Companies of Seattle, Washington. In his 25 years there he held a wide variety of jobs in the financial, sales and operating sides of their wood products, process chemicals and pulp and paper businesses including responsibilities as vice president of specialty paper operations and vice president and general manager of the Kraft group of Simpson. Mr. Seidl joined Fisher Mills Inc in 1998 as executive vice president and chief operating officer and was elected a director, president and chief executive officer of Fisher Mills Inc later that year. He completed his work at Fisher Mills with the divestiture of their distribution and manufacturing businesses in four states. In July 2003 Bryce Seidl became the sixth President and CEO of Pacific Science Center, assuming responsibility for one of the nation's largest science museums. He retired in 2014.
