Sue Bird

- Considered one of the greatest, and most winningest, Women's basketball players of all time
- Led U Conn Huskies to two NCAA titles (2000, 2002)
- Led Team USA to record five Olympic gold medals (2004, 2008, 2012, 2016, 2020)
- Played her entire 20-year professional basketball career for the Seattle Storm, leading team to four WNBA titles (2004, 2010, 2018, 2020)
- Seattle Storm retired her jersey, No 10, in 2022
- Meaningfully, Bird is an outspoken voice for change, using her position of influence to advocate for social change initiatives including LGBTQ+ rights and racial equity both in Seattle and across the country



- Honorary street sign for Seattle Storm, currently located at same corner, will remain
- Seattle Storm organization and Seattle Center fully support the street name change
