
## What We Do

## **Criminal Trends**












Chart 3: Criminal Cases Filed (excl. RALJ)





## KCCH Building Entry

- 364,400 people entered KCCH through magnetometer
- Over 1,400 per day
- 456,817 articles screened via X-ray



## External Courthouse Security

- Disorderly Conduct/Disturbances = 125
- Bomb Threat = 2
- Criminal Violations = 10 (Obstruction, Vandalism, Theft)

## Internal Courthouse Security

- Courtroom Alarms Triggered = 156
- Protection Escorts = 1,462
- Courtroom stand-by to assure peace = 418
- Incident Reports Initiated by Courthouse Security = 196
