

Update: Quarter 1

- 90% of all January contracts have been executed
- Seattle Youth Violence Prevention Initiative (SYVPI) officially moved to HSD
- ADS has added 15 new staff who are providing case management services
- Applications for Medicaid Case Management RFQ in review for May decision
- DVSA is conducting research and community engagement for June RFI
- Notice from HUD of \$30.2M in federal funding for Seattle/King County
- State of Emergency activities
 - Shelter, outreach, behavioral health capacity, flex funds, diversion, vehicle response
- Homeless Investment Analysis for long-term, system change
 - New investments, portfolio contract model, homeless investment policy framework
