1. BILL SUMMARY

- 1. Legislation Title:** A RESOLUTION calling for review of current methods for collecting data on Native Communities, and potential strategies for improving such data collection, and exploration of the need for capacity-building for organizations seeking to assist Native Communities.

Summary and background of the Legislation: This resolution articulates that the City Council’s Civic Development, Public Assets, and Native Communities Committee will work with the appropriate City and County executive departments, community partners, and service providers to:

- Review current methods for collecting, disseminating, and using data on American Indians and Alaskan Natives (“Native Communities”); and identify strategies for improving the collection of data if gaps exist. These data will be used to more effectively understand and address issues facing Native Communities; and
- Explore whether additional capacity-building assistance is needed to help organizations seeking to assist Native Communities to implement solutions to local issues.
