1. BILL SUMMARY

Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE relating to the City Light Department; authorizing the execution of the Maintenance Obligations and Ownership Agreement for Boundary Substation with the Bonneville Power Administration; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts.

Summary and background of the Legislation:

This legislation authorizes the City Light Department ("City Light") to execute an agreement with Bonneville Power Administration that will assist the parties in fulfilling their respective responsibilities with respect to NERC reliability standards compliance at Boundary Substation. By executing the Maintenance Obligations and Ownership Agreement for Boundary Substation, City Light will clarify its responsibilities with respect to Boundary substation equipment ownership and maintenance, which supports its mission to provide cost-effective and reliable power in an environmentally responsible and safe manner.

This legislation enables the replacement of the original 1966 Boundary Operations and Maintenance Agreement, which lacks details now considered necessary in electric utility contracts to sufficiently describe the specific compliance requirements of the parties. The proposed new agreement will serve these purposes with no change in cost.
