With experience in leadership, governance, and finance, I am expressing my interest in the non-expiring Seattle Public Library Board Trustee position of Tré Maxie. My tangible skills, civic engagement, and broad experience are assets, which could benefit Seattle Public Library and its stakeholders.

At the University of Washington School of Social Work, I am responsible for managing a five-year project funded by the Dean. Focused on building capacity among nonprofits in southeast and central Seattle, community members, educators, and emerging leaders are working to improve services benefiting children, youth, and families. In partnership with faculty members and a team of graduate students, we are engaging key leaders and funders to strategically implement meaningful social and academic programs. Launching this collaborative project as Communities in Action, our vision is that our communities are thriving because they support and build strong young people and families who are empowered, connected, educated, and have meaningful opportunities to come.

Prior to the University of Washington, I held the position of Foundation for Early Learning's Executive Director. Given my fundraising and organizational development experience, I made community needs—parent and caregiver resources—and fundraising key elements of our work. I am especially proud that as the program director I was able to create and implement, with Seattle Public Library, the Early Learning Public Library Partnership; then as executive director grow this collaboration across Washington State. My responsibilities at the Foundation for Early Learning included strategic planning, finance, public policy, program delivery, communications, and staff and board development.

During my four years at Philanthropy Northwest, I was responsible for the revenue generated through membership, fundraising, and special projects. As Philanthropy Northwest's membership director, I worked with our Member Relations and Development Committees to expand our membership, reengage corporate foundations, redefine philanthropy, resulting in increased revenue. My background also includes extensive credit union experience most recently serving on the governance board of Express Credit Union from 2009 through 2014. To Seattle Public Library, I offer my high level of professionalism and enthusiasm for strategic planning and policy-making.

Reviewing my civic and personal interests, I have worked with individuals from different political, socio-economic, educational, and ethnic backgrounds, while leading teams to reach its goals. My ability to work with diverse groups, including public and private funders, corporations, community-based organizations, and volunteers is a strength.
