You indicated that the City of Seattle is applying for a FEMA Grant. The grant application requires that in order to receive funding, the City must be a participant in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) and be in compliance with NFIP and State floodplain management laws and regulations.

This is to certify that the City of Seattle participates in the NFIP, and is a member in good standing in that program. The City's Community Identification Number is 530089. Chapter 25.06 of the Seattle Municipal Code is the City's floodplain management chapter; it has been reviewed and found to be fully compliant with NFIP and State floodplain management regulations.

The City of Seattle established eligibility in the Regular Phase of the NFIP on July 19, 1977. A Community Assistance Visit (CAV) was conducted by FEMA on August 6, 2008 and that CAV was successfully closed on August 12, 2008. The CAV determined that there are no unresolved NFIP or State issues, and that the City is fully compliant with all applicable regulations and program standards. The City does not currently have any outstanding CAV issues, so that determination is valid as of this time.
