

Proposed Amendments for CB 118907

PROPOSED AMENDMENT 1:

This proposed amendment specifies the relationship between the OPA Director and CPC when the OPA Director conducts community outreach.

Base ordinance language:

Section 10. Section 3.28.810 of the Seattle Municipal Code, last amended by Ordinance 122744, is renumbered, recodified in Subchapter I of Chapter 3.29, and amended as follows:

~~((3.28.810))~~ **3.29.020** **Office of ((Professional)) Police Accountability—Director ((-))**

16. Obtain information about community perspectives and concerns germane to OPA access and OPA’s oversight responsibilities by means including, but not necessarily limited to, seeking support from CPC and other community stakeholders on community outreach and receiving feedback on issues surfaced as a result of its community outreach activities.

Option 1 (Chair González; CM Burgess):

16. Obtain information about community perspectives and concerns germane to OPA access and OPA’s oversight responsibilities by means including, but not necessarily limited to, engaging CPC to conduct outreach to other community stakeholders and receiving feedback from CPC on issues surfaced as a result of the community outreach activities.

Option 2 (CM Sawant):

16. Obtain information about community perspectives and concerns germane to OPA access and OPA’s oversight responsibilities by means including, but not necessarily limited to, seeking support from CPC to engage other community stakeholders, conduct community outreach, and receive feedback.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT 2:

This proposed amendment specifies the composition of the search committee for the selection of the OPA Director.

Base ordinance language:

Section 10. Section 3.28.810 of the Seattle Municipal Code, last amended by Ordinance 122744, is renumbered, recodified in Subchapter I of Chapter 3.29, and amended as follows:

~~((3.28.810))~~ **3.29.020 Office of ((Professional)) Police Accountability—Director ((-))**

A representative of CPC shall serve as one of the search committee co-chairs. The Mayor shall either appoint from among the finalists or initiate a new search. The appointee shall be confirmed by a majority vote of the full City Council. The Mayor shall consult with CPC prior to reappointments.

Option 1 (Chair González; CM Burgess):

A CPC Commissioner shall serve as one of the search committee co-chairs. The Mayor shall either appoint from among the finalists or initiate a new search. The appointee shall be confirmed by a majority vote of the full City Council. The Mayor shall receive input from the CPC and the Inspector General prior to reappointments.

Option 2 (CM Herbold):

CPC Commissioners shall constitute at least 25 percent of the search committee, and one of the Commissioners on the search committee shall serve as a search committee co-chair. The Mayor shall either appoint from among the finalists or initiate a new search. The appointee shall be confirmed by a majority vote of the full City Council. The Mayor shall consult with CPC and the Inspector General prior to reappointments.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT 3:

This proposed amendment specifies the composition of the search committee for the selection of the Inspector General.

Base ordinance language:

Section 25. A new Section 3.29.114 of the Seattle Municipal Code is added to Subchapter II of Chapter 3.29 as follows:

3.29.114 Office of Inspector General—Appointment and removal

A representative of CPC shall serve as one of the search committee co-chairs. The Special Committee shall either appoint from among the finalists or initiate a new search. The appointee shall be confirmed by a majority vote of the full City Council. The Special Committee shall consult with CPC prior to reappointments.

Option 1 (Chair González; CM Burgess):

A CPC Commissioner shall serve as one of the search committee co-chairs. The committee responsible for public safety matters shall either appoint from among the finalists or initiate a new search. The appointee shall be confirmed by a majority vote of the full City Council. The committee responsible for public safety matters shall receive input from the CPC and the OPA Director prior to reappointments.

Option 2 (CM Herbold):

CPC Commissioners shall constitute at least 25 percent of the search committee, and one of the Commissioners on the search committee shall serve as a search committee co-chair. The committee responsible for public safety matters shall either appoint from among the finalists or initiate a new search. The appointee shall be confirmed by a majority vote of the full City Council. The committee responsible for public safety matters shall consult with CPC and the OPA Director prior to reappointments.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT 4:

This proposed amendment specifies who conducts the performance evaluation of the OPA Director and/or OPA. There is no current corresponding language in CB 118907.

Base ordinance language:

None.

Option 1 (Chair González; CM Burgess):

Add to Proposed SMC 3.29.020.C., under appointment and removal of the OPA Director:
7. The Mayor shall be responsible for the performance evaluation of the OPA Director, and shall seek the input of the public, City Council, City Attorney, OIG, Chief, SPD employees, and CPC.

And add to Proposed SMC 3.29.110.A., under OIG duties, and renumber subsequent numbers accordingly:

11. Provide input to the Mayor in advance of the Mayor's performance evaluation of the OPA Director.

And add to Proposed SMC 3.29.215.A., under CPC duties, and renumber subsequent numbers accordingly:

10. Provide input to the Mayor in advance of the Mayor's performance evaluation of the OPA Director.

Option 2 (CM Herbold):

Add to Proposed SMC 3.29.110.A., under Inspector General duties, and renumber subsequent numbers accordingly:

10. The Inspector General shall deliver to the Mayor an annual evaluation of the performance of OPA and its management and leadership. The Inspector General shall conduct this evaluation after soliciting public, Mayoral, City Attorney, City Council, Chief of Police, SPD employee, and CPC perspectives.

And add to Proposed SMC 3.29.215.A., under CPC duties, and renumber subsequent numbers accordingly:

10. Provide input to the Inspector General each year in advance of the Inspector General's evaluation of OPA.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT 5:

This proposed amendment specifies who conducts the performance evaluation of the Inspector General and/or OIG. There is no current corresponding language in CB 118907.

Base ordinance language:

None.

Option 1 (Chair González; CM Burgess):

Add to Proposed SMC 3.29.114, under appointment and removal of the Inspector General:
G. The City Council shall be responsible for the performance evaluation of the Inspector General and shall seek the input of the public, Mayor, City Attorney, Chief, OPA Director, other SPD employees, and CPC.

Add to Proposed SMC 3.29.020.A., under OPA Director duties, and renumber subsequent numbers accordingly:

15. Provide input to the City Council in advance of the City Council's performance evaluation of the Inspector General.

Add to Proposed SMC 3.29.215.A., under CPC duties, and renumber subsequent numbers accordingly:

9. Provide input to the City Council in advance of the City Council's performance evaluation of the Inspector General.

Option 2 (CM Herbold):

Add to Proposed SMC 3.29.215.A., under CPC duties, and renumber subsequent numbers accordingly:

9. Deliver to the Council an annual evaluation of the performance of OIG and its management and leadership. CPC shall conduct this evaluation after soliciting public, Mayoral, City Attorney, City Council, Chief of Police, OPA Director, and SPD employee perspectives.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT 6:

This proposed amendment responds to issues identified at the March 17, 2017, GESCNA meeting pertaining to clarifying roles and purpose language, emphasizing collaboration, and making technical corrections.
