Federal Response

- HB 2105 (Ortiz-Self) - Requires an employer to notify its workers within five business days of receiving a federal Notice of Inspection of Employment Eligibility Verification Forms I-9.
- HB 2165 (Obras) - Concerning false identification as a peace officer.
- SB 5855 (Valdez) - Concerning the use of face coverings by law enforcement officers.



Revenue

- SB 6346 (Pedersen)
 - Imposes a 9.9% tax on income over \$1 million beginning in 2028
 - 5% of funds to go to the Fair Start for Kids Account
 - Funds universal free school meals in 2027-2029
 - Expands eligibility for Working Families Tax Credit
 - Increases the B&O tax credit for small businesses
 - Provides a sales and use tax exemption for personal hygiene products, diapers, and over-the-counter drugs
 - Repeals sales tax on specified services that were enacted in the 2025 session
 - Intent to provide \$200m for local governments
- HB 2442 (Berg)
 - Allows Seattle to create a municipal fire protection district without reducing our statutory maximum tax rate or general property tax levy
 - Authorizes a new local 0.01% sales tax to fund children and families



Affordability

- HB 1128 (Fosse) - Establishing a child care workforce standards board.
- HB 2238 (Reeves) - Concerning statewide food security.



Housing & Homelessness

- HB 1687 (Reed) - Authorizes the state or a local government to assist a social housing public development authority in the planning, construction, or operation of housing projects under the Housing Cooperation Law.
- HB 2304 (Taylor) - Increasing the supply of condominiums by expanding the types of condominium buildings that may be subject to an express warranty of quality and express warranty insurance coverage.
- SB 5156 (Salomon) - Requires the State Building Code Council to adopt standards for cities and counties to allow passenger elevators minimally sized to meet federal accessibility requirements for apartment buildings with at most six stories and at most 24 units.
- SB 6027 (Alvarado) - Modifying requirements and allowed uses for certain funding related to providing and maintaining affordable housing and related services.



Public Safety

- SB 5880 (Wagoner) - Allows toxicology testing by certified or accredited laboratories for DUI court proceedings.
- HB 2320 (Salahuddin) - Prohibits manufacturing of certain firearms and firearm components through use of 3D printer or computer numerical control milling machine.



Capital Budget

- \$1.5 million for women's softball field equity at Lower Woodland Park.
- \$2.05 million for Seattle Center Fisher Pavilion decarbonization.
- \$6 million for Montlake Homes site acquisition.
- \$7.05 million for Mercy Housing for Lake City Community Center Redevelopment affordable housing.



Transportation

- \$12 million for addressing traffic impacts of Revive I-5.
- HB 2495 (Thomas) - Addressing the removal of vehicles by certain cities when obstructing the operation of streetcar vehicles or jeopardizing public safety.
- SB 6309 (Lias) - Providing for enhanced municipal permitting tools for high capacity transit projects.
 - Allows the City to accept, review, and issue permits while the RTA obtains property rights.

Climate & Environment

- HB 2199 (Richards) - Reducing impacts from derelict vessels.



Seattle priority bills that did not advance

- HB 2297 (Farivar) - Incentivizing grocery stores in underserved areas.
- SB 6148 (Lias) - Modifying the maximum terms of regional transit authority bond issues.
- HB 2100 (Scott) - Establishing a statewide payroll expense tax.
- SB 5098 (Valdez) - Restricting the possession of weapons on the premises of state or local public buildings, parks or playground facilities where children are likely to be present, and county fairs and county fair facilities.
- HB 1152 (Doglio) - Establishing secure storage requirements for firearms in vehicles and residences.
- HB 1923 (Nance) - Increasing the availability of passenger-only ferries by establishing the mosquito fleet act.

Operating Budget Overview

- Most significant spending increases resulted from increasing caseloads, federal impacts, and lawsuit settlements
- \$375 million sweep of the Public Works Assistance Account that is backfilled by \$279.5 million in new bonds in the capital budget
- \$880 million from the budget stabilization account
- \$880 million transfer from restatement of the LEOFF 1 pension fund (HB 2034) in 2029
- \$1 billion set aside for state self-insurance due to liability obligations
- New revenue from cutting tax breaks for prescription drug wholesalers, data center equipment, and insurers
- HR 1 impacts include funding long term care coverage for noncitizens losing access to Medicaid and implementation of work requirements for Medicaid and SNAP/FAP



Operating Budget Spending

- \$15 million for grants to HUD CoC providers to maintain permanent supportive housing
- \$3 million for additional attorneys for the Tenant Right to Counsel Program
- \$5 million for services to address domestic violence
- \$21.355 million for victim of crime services
- \$10.5 million for 911 program support and technology
- \$500,000 for statewide organization to conduct a retail crime pilot program focused on diversion-oriented programs
- \$30 million for grants through existing network of federal low-income energy assistance
- \$150,000 to study financial incentives to address seismic retrofits of unreinforced masonry buildings (URMs) and \$150,000 complete inventory of URMs in Washington
- \$8.5 million for reproductive health services



Operating Budget Reductions

- \$900,000 reduction to law enforcement assisted diversion grants
- \$1.96 million reduction to recovery navigator program
- \$1.2 million reduction for health engagement hub pilot program sites
- \$1 million reduction to naloxone distribution
- \$2.155 million reduction to grants for firearm safety and violence prevention
- \$1.6 million reduction for public building energy audits
- \$91.5 million reduction to Working Connections Childcare through modification of attendance-based provider reimbursement and eliminates the transition to prospective, enrollment-based payment (HB 2689)



Capital Budget

- \$123 million to Housing Trust Fund including:
 - \$96 million for housing for low-income and special needs populations
 - \$55 million for first-time, low-income homeownership.
 - \$49 million for multifamily rental housing
 - \$5 million for urgent repair grants or risk mitigation for affordable housing
- \$11 million for Weatherization Plus Health grants
- \$3 million for urban and community forest grant program



Transportation Budget

- \$1.3 billion for road and bridge preservation paid for by new bonds
- \$45 million for state and local flood-related highway recovery loans
- \$31 million for electrification of ferry terminals
- \$28 million in ferry system preservation

Budget & Revenue

- HB 1408 (Santos) - Requires 30 percent of the state sales tax revenue at qualified facilities to be deposited into the Community Preservation and Development Authority (CPDA) Account.
- HB 2610 (Street) - Expands the allowable use of property for the nonprofit low-income homeownership property tax exemption to include the rent or lease of property to an organization for certain community serving purposes.

General Government

- HB 2034 (Ormsby) - Terminates the LEOFF Plan 1, creates the Restated LEOFF plan on June 30, 2029, with identical pension benefits. Funds the newly created Restated LEOFF System with existing LEOFF Plan 1 assets at 110 percent of the actuarial value of the projected benefits. Deposits the remainder in the Pension Surplus Holding Account, which may be transferred to the state general fund.
- HB 1170 (Shavers) - Requires providers of certain generative artificial intelligence systems to include provenance data in content created by their systems. Requires government agencies to notify consumers when they are interacting with certain AI systems.

Climate & Environment

- HB 1903 (Mena) - Establishing a state-wide low-income energy assistance program.
- SB 6355 (Hunt) - Establishes the WA Electric Transmission Authority to support the expansion of and upgrades to the electric transmission system and be a state-wide resource for transmission.



Healthcare & Behavioral Health

- SB 5981 (Cleveland) - Prohibits a drug manufacturer from denying, restricting, or prohibiting the acquisition of a 340B drug by specific health care providers or a pharmacy under contract with a health care provider. Prohibits a drug manufacturer from requiring any claims, utilization, purchasing data as a condition for allowing the acquisition of a 340B drug.
- HB 2242 (Bronoske) - Authorizes the Department of Health to issue immunization recommendations and guidance. Replaces the requirement that health plans provide coverage for immunizations recommended by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices with a requirement to cover immunizations that have a recommendation from DOH.

Housing & Homelessness

- SB 6026 (Alvarado) - Prohibits cities and counties from excluding residential uses in areas zoned for commercial or mixed-use development. Prohibits cities from requiring mixed use or ground floor commercial or retail with limited exceptions.
- HB 2266 (Petersen) - Establishes siting requirements for transitional housing, permanent supportive housing, indoor emergency shelters, and indoor emergency housing (STEP housing). Restricts permitting and other requirements that may be imposed on STEP housing.

Housing & Homelessness

- SB 5937 (Pedersen) - Regulating the use of smart access systems in rental housing.
- SB 6200 (Slatter) - Restricting landlords from prohibiting tenants from installing portable cooling devices, with certain exceptions.



Labor & Commerce

- HB 2294 (Farivar) - Prohibiting negative use restrictions on real property that have the effect of limiting consumer access to food and medicine.
- HB 2355 (Thomas) - Establishing labor protections for domestic workers.



Native Communities & Tribal Governments

- SB 6034 (Kauffman) - Concerning statutory establishment of the Governor's Office of Indian Affairs.



Public Safety & Criminal Justice

- SB 5925 (Hansen) - Concerning the general powers and duties of the Attorney General's Office.
- SB 6002 (Trudeau) - Establishes a regulatory structure for the use of Automatic License Plate Reader (ALPR) systems and the data captured. Restricts the use of ALPR systems by state and local agencies, sets retention periods for the data collected, and limits the sharing of data.



Social Programs & Education

- HB 2523 (Reeves) - Concerning the Community Reinvestment Program.
- SB 5872 (Wilson, C.) - Establishing the PreK Promise Account for the purposes of receiving any gifts, grants, or donations made for the ECEAP program.
- SB 5963 (Nobles) - Modifying funding for the Passport to Careers Program for the Washington College Grant.



Transportation

- HB 1980 (Zahn) - Authorizes local authorities, with approval from public transportation agencies, to permit private employer transportation services to use business access and transit-only lanes in counties with a population more than 2 million.
