1. BILL SUMMARY

Legislation Title:

A RESOLUTION initiating a proceeding for vacating a portion of the alley on the block between NE 45th Street, Roosevelt Way NE, NE 47th Street, and 11th Avenue NE pursuant to Chapter 35.79 Revised Code of Washington (RCW) and Seattle Municipal Code (SMC) Chapter 15.62.

Summary and Background of the Legislation:

This Resolution starts the process of considering vacating a portion of the alley on the block bounded by NE 45th Street, Roosevelt Way NE, NE 47th Street, and 11th Avenue NE in the University District, Council District 4. Sound Transit is the owner of the two parcels on the north side of NE 45th Street, which are separated by an alley. Sound Transit's goal for the property is to issue a Request for Proposals for a developer to build affordable housing on these parcels. More affordable housing units would be able to be built on these if the alley were vacated. Because the vacation of the alley between the Sound Transit properties would serve a public purpose, this Resolution initiates the alley vacation review process, as provided for under Revised Code of Washington Chapter 35.79, Seattle Municipal Code Chapter 15.62 and the City's Street Vacation Policies. It does not obligate the Council to grant the alley vacation.
