1. BILL SUMMARY

Legislation Title: A RESOLUTION designating the monthly President Pro Tem of the City Council of The City of Seattle for 2025; superseding Resolution 32161.

Summary and Background of the Legislation: This resolution would update the 2025 schedule (established previously via Resolution 32161, in February 2025) for members of the City Council that are assigned and designated to serve as President Pro Tem, according to Rule I.D of the General Rules and Procedures of the City Council. Effective July 7, 2025, the City Council District 5 position was vacant, and on July 28, 2025, a new member was appointed. Rule I.D provides that a President Pro Tem shall be designated biennially on a monthly rotation basis, based on seniority, to act in the absence of the President, with the next scheduled Pro Tem to act in the President Pro Tem's absence. This legislation makes the following changes:
