## Revenue

- Excise tax on Zero Emission Vehicle program credits
- Estate tax increase
  - Top tier rate increases from 20% to 35%
- Capital gains tax increase
  - 2.9% increase on gains of \$1m or more
- Establishing sales tax on currently exempt items/services
- B&O tax increase
  - 0.5% surcharge on large businesses
  - Increase for various other categories
- Property tax growth limit increasing cap to 3%
