- 4. Meet the moment with inclusive engagement






# Values Drive Plan Development


Our organizational values feed the STP's goals and technical elements.

## Phase 1 Engagement: Establish a Shared Vision



- Build on engagement efforts to reach underrepresented communities



## **Upcoming Milestones**

#### 2022

- September: Launch phase 2 of community engagement
- Fall: Complete our internal technical analysis, including modal network integration and modernization tasks

#### 2023

- April: Publish the draft plan for public review
- April: Launch phase 3 of community engagement
- Summer: Transmit Mayor's recommended plan to City Council
