He served as co-chair for the Plymouth Housing Group's successful \$52 million capital campaign to provide housing for the homeless. He currently serves on the Seattle Convention Center Board, formerly the Washington State Convention and Trade Center Board. He was a founder and director of Plaza Bank focused on serving the Hispanic and Latino community.

While headquartered in Los Angeles, Mr. Flowers served on the boards of: The Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce, KCET public television, the Las Virgenes Institute for Resource Management, the California Bankers Association, the Los Angeles Urban League, and the California Business Roundtable.
