Current Process

- SFD actively working with property owners and current Seattle Fire Code. Education, options to restore to safe condition or demolish. Goal: voluntary compliance.
- Typical building removal process involves insurance review, permit review and issuance, demolition activities, and may take up to 1+ years.
- Challenges
 - Repeated unauthorized entry and fires while property is moving toward demolition.
 - Non-responsive owners.


- Since the pandemic, more vacant buildings and more transient activity
- Riskier rescue operations vs. safer defensive suppression
- Spread to nearby buildings: hazard for neighbors, disrupts local businesses
- 3 occupant deaths in 2023 in Seattle







Derelict Buildings: Language Diversity






Derelict Buildings: Income Diversity








What the Ordinance Does – Amends Seattle Fire Code

Clarifies Fire Chief's existing "summary abatement" authority

- Imminent danger to life and property, Fire Chief already has authority to take action directly to address the unsafe condition.
- Ordinance clarifies that this includes demolition and adds ability to pass the costs back to the property owner.

Clarifies Fire Chief's existing "abatement" authority

- Other unsafe buildings, not an imminent hazard, Fire Chief already has authority to require building owner to fix or demolish.
- Ordinance adds ability for Fire Chief to directly address the unsafe condition, including fencing/securing property and demolition, and to pass the costs back to the property owner.

Adds authority for the City to use RCW 35.21.955 to place a lien against the public nuisance property.
