## 1. BILL SUMMARY

# **Legislation Title:**

AN ORDINANCE relating to wastewater services of Seattle Public Utilities; and amending subsections 21.28.040.B and 21.76.040.A of the Seattle Municipal Code to adjust the wastewater volume rate and adjust credits to low-income wastewater customers.

## **Summary and background of the Legislation:**

This ordinance would revise wastewater rates and adjust wastewater low-income assistance. It would increase rates to meet debt service coverage requirements driven largely by capital financing decisions.

The 2016-2018 Drainage & Wastewater Rate Study proposes sewer rates for 2016 through 2018, which, when applied to the current demand forecast, will increase 2016, 2017 and 2018 revenues \$8,786,634, \$9,002,043 and \$12,073,484, respectively, over current law.
