1. BILL SUMMARY

Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE relating to the City Light Department; declaring certain real property rights surplus to utility needs; authorizing the General Manager and Chief Executive Officer to execute an agreement for the City to grant an easement for parking and access purposes over a portion of the City's fee-owned Bothell-Canal Transmission Corridor at 17524 Aurora Avenue North in the City of Shoreline, Washington; accepting payment for the true and full value of the easement from GCW Shoreline, LLC, and WG @ Shoreline, LLC; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts.

Summary: This legislation authorizes Seattle City Light to grant an easement to GCW Shoreline, LLC, and WG @ Shoreline, LLC, for parking and access for a Walgreen's Store in Shoreline, Washington, in City Light's Bothell-Canal Transmission Corridor, and authorizes the acceptance of \$525,000 for this easement.

Background: GCW Shoreline, LLC, and WG @ Shoreline, LLC (GCW and WG Shoreline") own property in Shoreline, Washington that is leased to the Walgreen Company ("Walgreen's"). GCW and WG Shoreline currently lease a portion City Light's transmission corridor abutting their parcel, which provides access and customer parking for Walgreen's.

GCW and WG Shoreline are seeking to sell their property. The lease between GCW and WG Shoreline and City Light has a 30-day cancellation provision. Without permanent rights for access and parking, GCW and WG Shoreline conclude that their property is unmarketable. For that reason, GCW and WG Shoreline have requested to purchase a permanent easement for parking and access within a portion of City Light's abutting transmission corridor.

The proposed easement would prohibit GCW and WG Shoreline from constructing any structures in the easement area, would allow City Light to install additional transmission or distribution poles anywhere in the easement area, and provides for other prohibited uses by the Grantee and allowable uses by City Light, consistent with the continued transmission use of the City's property.

GCW and WG Shoreline have agreed to pay City Light \$525,000 for the permanent easement, based on an independent appraisal by an MAI appraiser.
