- An accounting of how funds within the Human Services Department's (HSD) Community Support and Assistance BCL have been used to date to implement the Vehicle License Fee rebate and the Low Income Access programs, including:
  - The number of Vehicle License Fee rebate applications received by HSD and how many rebates have been issued by HSD:
  - b. The average processing time for Vehicle License Fee rebate applications and any backlog of applications; and
  - c. The number of Seattle residents enrolled in the ORCA Lift

program by HSD.

- An Outreach and Enrollment Plan for the Executive's future implementation of the Vehicle License Fee rebate and Low Income Access programs, including:
  - Short- and long-term goals related to outreach and marketing of both programs in order to increase awareness and increase enrollment in the programs;

CITY OF SEATTLE 1 ORDINANCE 124782 2 COUNCIL BILL 118391 3 AN ORDINANCE relating to the 2015 Budget; amending Ordinance 124648, which adopted the 4 2015 Budget; changing appropriations to the Seattle Department of Transportation and to 5 the Human Services Department; creating both exempt and non-exempt positions; 6 authorizing the Director of Finance to enter into an interlocal agreement with the State 7 Department of Licensing; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts; all by at least a 8 3/4 vote of the City Council. 9 10 WHEREAS, in Resolution 12, the Governing Board of the Seattle Transportation Benefit District 11 (STBD) submitted a ballot measure (STBD Proposition 1) to the qualified electors of the 12 STBD to authorize up to a one-tenth of one percent sales and use tax and an annual 13 vehicle license fee of up to an additional \$60 per registered vehicle with a \$20 rebate for 14 low-income individuals, for the purposes of funding Metro Transit service in Seattle; and 15 WHEREAS, on November 4, 2014, STBD Proposition 1 was approved by a majority of qualified 16 electors of the STBD and authorized up to a one-tenth of one percent sales and use tax 17 and an annual vehicle license fee of up to an additional \$60 per registered vehicle with a 18 \$20 rebate for low-income individuals, for the purposes of funding Metro Transit service 19 in Seattle; and 20 WHEREAS, on December 1, 2014, in Resolution 14, the Governing Board of the STBD imposed 21 the revenue measures ratified by the approval of STBD Proposition 1 necessary to fund 22 Metro Transit service in Seattle; and 23 WHEREAS, on February 17, 2015, in Resolution 17, the Governing Board of the STBD 24 amended the STBD's 2015 budget to appropriate the revenues from STBD Proposition 1; 25 and 26

WHEREAS, The City of Seattle and the STBD entered into an interlocal agreement (authorized by STBD Resolution 2) to formalize the relationship between The City of Seattle and the STBD in order to implement transportation improvements funded through the STBD; and WHEREAS, on February 17, 2015 in Resolution 16, the Governing Board of the STBD authorized the STBD to amend the interlocal agreement with The City of Seattle to address new functions as a result of STBD Proposition 1; and WHEREAS, Ordinance 124648 adopted a budget, including a capital improvement program and position modifications, for The City of Seattle for 2015 including funds for the Seattle Department of Transportation 2015 Budget, but did not include appropriations for the

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

implementation of STBD Proposition 1; NOW, THEREFORE;

Section 1. In order to pay for necessary costs and expenses incurred, but for which insufficient appropriations were made due to causes that were not foreseen at the time of the making of the 2015 Budget, appropriations for the following items in the 2015 budget are increased from the funds shown, as follows:

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Of the amount in the Mobility-Operations BCL, \$8,500,000 is appropriated solely to pay for contract expenses that occur between the termination of the contract and the subsequent service change in the event that the subsequent service change falls on the following calendar year. Unspent funds so appropriated shall carry forward to subsequent fiscal years until they are exhausted or abandoned by ordinance.

Section 5. Any act consistent with the authority of this ordinance taken after passage and prior to its effective date is hereby ratified and confirmed.
