1. BILL SUMMARY

Legislation Title: A RESOLUTION relating to the Seattle Department of Parks and Recreation; authorizing applications for grant funding assistance to the Washington Recreation and Conservation Office for Youth Athletics Facilities projects as provided in WAC 286 and subsequent legislative action.

Summary and background of the Legislation: This proposed legislation authorizes the Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) to submit grant applications to the State of Washington Recreation and Conservation Office (RCO) for state funding assistance in the amount of \$250,000 to support renovation of the West Seattle Stadium. This resolution is required as part of the formal RCO grant application process. Improvements funded by the RCO grant and City match are:

- Resurfacing the 8-lane track with rubberized track surface;
- Replacing the pole vault and high jump landing pit and standards;
- Updating long jump, shot put, and javelin throw areas;
- Replacing 5 flights of hurdles;
- Improving ADA accessibility (pathway); and
- Upgrading amenities: North Grandstand seating, locker rooms and restrooms.

DPR applies for RCO grants each year and has garnered a strong success rate in securing additional funding for planned capital projects. In 2015, DPR will complete an RCO application in the Youth Athletic Facilities (YAF) program. The total funding request will be for \$250,000.

The RCO grants require a local match, and will fund only projects that are included in DPR's comprehensive plan (Seattle Parks and Recreation Plan 2000). The recommended project meets both criteria. DPR's required matching funds for the West Seattle Stadium Track and Field Renovations will be appropriated in the Seattle Park District Major Maintenance Fund (Fix It First Initiative).

RCO will announce the grant award recommendations in November 2015, but the actual grant awards will not be allocated until 2016. Project planning and design for the West Seattle Stadium Track and Field Renovations project is anticipated to begin in 2016 with construction planned to start in 2017 after a contract for the grant funding has been fully executed. RCO funding will support currently unfunded project elements.
