ORDINANCE 124812 2 COUNCIL BILL 118439 3 4 AN ORDINANCE relating to the Technology Matching Fund Program; making allocations and 5 authorizing implementation of certain Technology Matching Fund projects in 2015; 6 providing that 2015 appropriations for the Technology Matching Fund from the Cable 7 Television Franchise Subfund and from the Information Technology Fund shall 8 automatically carry forward into the 2016 fiscal year; allowing that any unspent funds 9 from an individual project may be applied to another Technology Matching Fund project; 10 and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts. 11 12 WHEREAS, The City of Seattle (City) has determined that it is important to enable digital 13 equity, foster broadband adoption, and provide digital opportunities for all its residents, 14 including sufficient access to electronic information, technology literacy, and the 15 application of technology for civic engagement; and 16 WHEREAS, Resolution 29673 established a Technology Matching Fund Program for such 17 purposes and identified project selection criteria and a process for selecting projects; and 18 WHEREAS, the City has appropriated \$470,000 in the 2015 Adopted Budget (Ordinance 19 124648) from the Information Technology Fund for the Community Technology Program 20 to implement Technology Matching Fund projects funded by the Cable Television 21 Franchise Subfund; and 22 WHEREAS, the Community Technology Advisory Board has recommended projects for 23 funding, and the Chief Technology Officer concurs with those recommendations; NOW, 24 THEREFORE, 25 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS: 26

Section 3. Any portion of the \$470,000 allocated to the Technology Matching Fund Program from the appropriation made from the Cable Television Franchise Subfund for the Cable Fee Support to Information Technology Fund Budget Control Level (D160B) and from the appropriation made from the Information Technology Fund for the Office of Electronic Communications Budget Control Level (D4400) in the 2015 Adopted Budget, not spent or encumbered in 2015, shall not lapse at the end of the 2015 fiscal year but shall automatically carry over into the 2016 fiscal year until fully expended, abandoned or reappropriated to other authorized activities; in addition, any unspent funds from an individual project may be applied to another Technology Matching Fund project; provided, however, that the appropriations shall lapse at the end of the 2016 fiscal year unless carried over further by a future ordinance.

Section 4. Any acts done consistent with and after the passage and prior to the effective date of this ordinance are hereby ratified and confirmed.
