Women's Domestic Violence Advocate - YWCA of Missoula - JVC NW/AmeriCorps

Aug 2014 - July 2015

- Serve as one of two full-time domestic violence advocates working in the Pathways domestic violence program, managing a seven room confidential shelter, answering calls on a 24-hour crisis hotline and hosting open walk-i for community members.
