g) Please describe any perceived implication for the principles of the Race and Social Justice Initiative. Does this legislation impact vulnerable or historically disadvantaged communities?

Yes. Currently, race data aggregates diverse immigrants and refugees from Europe, the Middle East, and North Africa into the "White" category; those from other parts of Africa into the "Black" category; those from Hawaii, Guam, Samoa, or other Pacific Islands into the "Pacific Islander" category; those from the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Indian subcontinent including, for example, Cambodia, China, India, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Pakistan, the Philippine Islands, Thailand, and Vietnam, into the "Asian American" category; and original people from North and South America who maintain tribal affiliation or community attachment into the "American Indian or Alaskan Native" category.

For diverse immigrant and refugee groups, aggregated data masks differences that exist in socioeconomic status, educational attainment, health, and other areas. For example, aggregated data at the state level shows that only 13% of Asian American adults in Washington lack a high school diploma, but disaggregated data shows that over 30% of Cambodian and Vietnamese adults lack a high school diploma.

This legislation will spur the City to examine the limitations of its current data practices and recommend ways to disaggregate data and reform data collection and analysis such that departments can improve its data-driven policy and resource allocation decisions.
