Dedication Acceptance Ordinances

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Background

- Developers may be required to dedicate property to the City as part of the City's Land Use Code (SMC Chapter 23.53) on new private development or redevelopment projects
- The property would be used to widen a street or alley, or obtain easement rights for sidewalk purposes, that are identified during plan review by the City's Department of Planning and Development
- The dedicated property rights are then acquired from the property owners by the Department of Transportation

Background

- Once the property rights are recorded, the Department of Transportation creates and proposes a Council Bill to accept the deeds and easements according to Articles IV, Section 14, of the Seattle Charter
- Currently, the deeds and easements are accepted in separate ordinances in batches of approximately 20
