### **1. BILL SUMMARY**

**Legislation Title:**

A RESOLUTION relating to Sound Transit, providing recommendations to the Sound Transit Board as to the content of the proposed Sound Transit 3 (ST3) ballot measure to be submitted to the voters in November 2016.

**Summary and background of the Legislation:**

Sound Transit plans to submit to the voters in November 2016 a proposed Sound Transit 3 (ST3) ballot measure for the next phase of regional high-capacity transit facilities and services. This resolution provides recommendations from the City Council to the Sound Transit Board as to the content of the proposed ST3 ballot measure.
