CITY OF SEATTLE 1 ORDINANCE 2. COUNCIL BILL 118595 3 4 AN ORDINANCE authorizing an agreement with the Arboretum Foundation for support of the 5 Seattle Japanese Garden. 6 7 WHEREAS, Seattle Parks and Recreation desires to develop the Seattle Japanese Garden 8 ("Garden"), located within the Washington Park Arboretum ("Arboretum"), to ensure its 9 long-term sustainability and preserve the cultural connection the Garden provides; and 10 WHEREAS, in order to determine how best to operate and support the Garden, Seattle Parks and 11 Recreation and the Japanese Garden Society undertook an Optimal Operations Study 12 ("Study"); and 13 WHEREAS, the Study evaluated operating models and concluded that operation by a nonprofit 14 entity would best serve the Garden's long-term needs; and 15 WHEREAS, the Arboretum Foundation ("Foundation"), a Washington nonprofit corporation, 16 has offered to take over fundraising, volunteer, and advocacy responsibilities for the 17 18 Garden; and WHEREAS the Foundation has a long history and a proven track record supporting the 19 Arboretum in which the Garden is located by, among other things, delivering events, 20 fundraising, and providing marketing and membership support and both the City and the 21 Foundation will be advantaged by the geographic proximity and complementary missions 22 of the Garden and the Arboretum; and 23

WHEREAS, the City and the Foundation have negotiated the terms and conditions under which the Foundation is willing to undertake such fundraising, volunteer, and advocacy responsibilities for the Garden; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Superintendent of Parks and Recreation or the Superintendent's designee is authorized for and on behalf of The City of Seattle to negotiate an agreement with the Arboretum Foundation for the support of the Seattle Japanese Garden that is consistent with the terms and conditions contained in the Terms of Agreement between the parties, included as Attachment 1 to this ordinance.

1	Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force 30 days after its approval by			
2	the Mayor, but if not approved and returned by the Mayor within ten days after presentation, it			
3	shall take effect as provided by Seattle Municipal Code Section 1.04.020.

TERMS OF AGREEMENT

JAPANESE GARDEN TRANSITION

The purpose of this Term Sheet is to set forth the understanding of The City of Seattle (City) and The Arboretum Foundation (Foundation) with respect to the operation of the Japanese Garden as the Foundation prepares to take over fundraising responsibilities for the Garden previously undertaken by the Associated Recreation Council (ARC). The undersigned agree that this Term Sheet is not a binding contract but is an expression of the principal terms proposed by each to accomplish their mutual objectives. Neither party shall have any obligation to the other until a final agreement is executed.

I. Basic Obligation of Arboretum Foundation. The Foundation will:

- 1. Replace ARC as the primary support organization of the Japanese Garden.
- 2. Recognize Seattle Parks and Recreation (SPR) as the owner and operator of the Seattle Japanese Garden.
- 3. Work with SPR to raise funds, recruit volunteers and advocate for the Japanese Garden, in a similar manner to which it provides support to the other parts of the Washington Park Arboretum; hire sufficient staff to provide the services to be performed under the agreement.
- 4. Support implementation of designated events.
- 5. Coordinate and train volunteers consistent with SPR policies.
- 6. Develop and implement a Japanese Garden Membership Program.
- 7. Collaborate with SPR on a branding and marketing strategy.
- 8. Work with SPR to develop a public education and cultural enrichment program.
- 9. Provide an annual report, work plan, and financial report SPR.

II. Basic Obligations of the City of Seattle. The City will:

1. Operate, maintain and manage the Seattle Japanese Garden, including grounds, entry gatehouse and buildings associated with the garden.

- Coordinate with the Foundation as the primary support organization for the Japanese Garden, with respect to managing and conducting events, fundraising, membership, volunteer coordinating, branding and marketing, and advocacy.
- 3. Provide Tateuchi Room rental and usage for the Foundation on an agreed-upon schedule.
- 4. Provide the Foundation with timely input on policy issues.
- Each year, provide an agreed share of Gatehouse fees to the Foundation as described in Section IV.

III. Obligations Common to both Parties. The parties will:

- 1. Enter into an agreement spelling out the parties' arrangement with the intent to ensure the financial sustainability of the Japanese Garden. The term of the Agreement shall be five years and the Agreement shall be reviewed together annually to ensure that the arrangement works for both parties.
- 2. Work together in good faith to identify the best way to achieve long-term sustainability for the Japanese Garden; ensuring that SPR can continue to provide the necessary maintenance and operation and that the Foundation can administer the fundraising and special events, memberships, marketing and volunteer programs.
- 3. Work with ARC on the transition plan.
- 4. Ensure that the history and culture of the Japanese Garden is reflected and honored through programming, priorities and cultural events.
- 5. Look for additional opportunities to bring the public, in particular the Japanese cultural community, to enjoy this gem in our Parks and Recreation system.
