Michelle Winery and Amphitheater. The allegations of this suit range from discriminatory ticketing practices to its seating arrangements to accessible parking, and accessible route access. A settlement was reached.

#### • Reynoldson v. University of Washington (Pending)

A suit filed in United States District Court in the Western District of Washington alleging numerous violations under the Americans with Disabilities Act and the Washington Law Against Discrimination at Alaska Airlines Arena at Hec Edmundson Pavilion on the University of Washington campus. The allegations of this suit range from discriminatory ticketing practices to its seating arrangements to accessible parking, signage, and ramp access.
