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1. BILL SUMMARY

Legislation Title: AN ORDINANCE increasing the fee for marijuana business licenses; amending Section 6.500.080 of the Seattle Municipal Code.

Summary and background of the Legislation: This legislation increases the marijuana business license fees to \$1500 for businesses located in Seattle and \$750 for businesses outside of Seattle, effective January 1, 2017.

This legislation is necessary since the current fee revenue from marijuana business licenses is inadequate to provide the resources for administrative, policy and enforcement efforts that are necessary to ensure compliance with the Seattle Municipal Code and State law.

The marijuana enforcement program will ensure the equitable application of the SMC, which disallows marijuana businesses from being within specific distances to community resources. The program is also responsible for ensuring that communities receive complaint resolution with regard to marijuana businesses, which can have an adverse effect on neighborhoods, especially if marijuana businesses are able to congregate in certain areas.
