1. BILL SUMMARY

Legislation Title:

AN ORDINANCE relating to parking rates; amending Section 11.16.121 of the Seattle Municipal Code to set new limits on parking rates at parking payment devices.

Summary and background of the Legislation:

This proposal would change the maximum and minimum on-street parking rates allowed under the Seattle Municipal Code, which currently provides SDOT authority to set rates between \$4.00 and \$0.75/hour. These amounts have not changed since 2010, despite significant growth in parking demand and strong economic activity. This legislation would establish new maximum and minimum rates of \$5 to \$0.50 per hour.

Through the Performance-Based Parking Pricing Program, SDOT conducts an Annual Paid Parking Study and uses data to make rate and other parking management adjustments so that approximately one or two open spaces are available on each blockface throughout the day. The 2016 Paid Parking Study identified areas that are currently at the minimum parking rate and below the target occupancy, and areas of paid parking that are currently at the maximum parking rate and above the target occupancy, for some part of the day. This legislation would allow more flexibility in setting parking rates to achieve the target occupancy.
