#### **1. BILL SUMMARY**

# a. Legislation Title:

- A RESOLUTION requesting evaluation of residential displacement as it relates to increases in development capacity in certain areas; and declaring the Council's intent to consider strategies to mitigate any loss of subsidized affordable units and naturally occurring affordable units resulting from an increase in development capacity.
- b. Summary and background of the Legislation: Building on previous work and discussions related to mitigating residential displacement, and specifically recent work on Council Bill 118862 which would implement zoning changes in the University District, this resolution requests that the Office of Planning and Community Development (OPCD) completes an evaluation of residential displacement as it relates to the proposal being developed to increase development capacity in certain areas of the City. This analysis will provide the City Council information that could inform future policy decisions related to mitigating any loss of subsidized affordable units and naturally occurring affordable units resulting from an increase in development capacity.
