VISION

Police accountability is more than the complainthandling system, but also encompasses how

- Individual and institutional police performance is tracked
- Corrections are made
- Excellence is rewarded

AND

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VISION

 Improvements in systems, policies, and procedures that support employee performance and build community trust are institutionalized

KEY PRINCIPLES

The police accountability system must be designed to earn maximum public and police confidence in its legitimacy and its capacity to improve performance

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KEY PRINCIPLES

True Independence Objectivity, Fairness, and Just Outcomes Access and Transparency Community Voice in Oversight Ongoing Systemic Improvements

THE LONG ROAD HERE

There has been a long history of community advocacy for police reform

- MEDC's Multiracial Task Force on Police Accountability sought DOJ review and made recommendations
- Consent Decree in place supporting reform

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THE LONG ROAD HERE

- CPC was mandated to review and make recommendations to improve the police accountability system
- CPC issued police accountability system recommendations in April 2014 and drafted the 1st iteration of the legislation in November of 2014

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THE MAYOR'S PROPOSAL

The Mayor's proposal largely parallels structural elements the CPC put forward between 2014-2016

- Strengthened OPA and increased civilianization of the office
- Inspector General with broader authority than OPA Auditor
- Community Police Commission with more authority and oversight responsibilities
- New mechanisms to support better accountability system-wide and for the long term

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WHAT IS NEEDED?

The proposed structural approach will only work if vital pieces are in place and supported

- Independence of all oversight entities
- Transparency
- Diversification of political power
- Strong community-based input and oversight

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Overview of Key Areas that Strengthen Accountability and Community Oversight

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Better ensure the independence of the OPA, Inspector General, and the CPC

- Budgeting mechanisms to ensure adequate capacity and autonomy
- Appointment of the CPC Executive Director
- Provision for independent legal counsel to avoid inevitable conflicts

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Better ensure public access to the system and the community's voice at the table

 Mechanisms to support public education and community ability to help drive the accountability agenda

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Better ensure the CPC reflects a diversity of interests, expertise, and perspectives

• Number of CPC members, their representation, and residency requirements

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Better ensure accountability to the public

• Performance evaluations of the OPA and OIG and their management and leadership
