ADVENTURE MUSICAL THEATER

Adventure Musical Theater Touring Company creates original musicals to share the history and culture of the Northwest with elementary and middle schools throughout Washington.

- Started in 1994, AMT is our longest running Education program.
- We serve 62,250 K-8 students with 149 performances.
 We had 26 performances in Seattle Public Schools for 12,000+ students; 22 performances were free.
- This year we produced a new musical, Free Boy, which tours February-May 2017 across the state.


The 5th Avenue High School Musical Awards honor outstanding achievement in high school musical theater and celebrate the hard work and dedication of students and educators.

- 2017 marks our 15th awards ceremony




Just The Facts


- 89 RSP Participants representing 48 Washington State schools

Creating Intersections: Organizations

- Free 10-week classroom residencies at Target Schools








Theater for ALL: Beyond "Inclusivity"

Empowering Young

Artists Initiative (EYAI)

- Tuition-free program
- Recruit from Target Schools
- Breakdown barriers
- 10 weeks of musical theater master classes (acting, singing, dancing) and dialogue.





The 10-Minute Musical Project (2016)

- Songwriting, book writing, directing and workshop process
- 30 students take on all the roles, including composer, lyricist, playwright, stage manager, director, actor, music director
- Summer workshops, two-week long intensive rehearsal process, and staged reading of four musicals
- Tuition-free
