The BREAKTHROUGH received the top prize, *Diamond Award* at the 2016 European Independent Film Awards in Paris, third place *Bronze Award* at the 2015 Global Music Awards in Los Angeles and was featured in 2016 New York Film Week and 2016 Las Vegas Lift-Off Film Festivals

Dr. Quinton Morris enjoys a multifaceted career as concert violinist, educator, entrepreneur and filmmaker.

In 2015, Quinton founded Key to Change, a nonprofit with the mission of igniting positive change in the world through music and education. Key to Change has a violin studio in South King County, which will serve middle and high school students of color and lower economic backgrounds in Renton, Kent, Auburn, Maple Valley, and Federal Way neighborhoods.

Quinton recently returned home from his BREAKTHROUGH World Tour, which paired recitals with educational outreach and community service in hospitals and orphanages. He performed, lectured, and taught in over 25 cities across five continents, with an emphasis on providing education and musical materials to under-resourced communities.

The tour also featured screenings of Quinton's short film The BREAKTHROUGH, which premiered at the Seattle Art Museum and the Louvre Museum in Paris, among other distinguished venues. Quinton directed and starred in the film, which tells a modernized story of the Chevalier de Saint-Georges: a musician of African origin who, against all odds, rose to become one of the most prolific and forgotten figures of the 18th century.

Additional career highlights include solo appearances with the Seattle Symphony, three consecutive years of sold out recitals at Carnegie Hall, eleven years as Artistic Director of The Young Eight String Octet and a TEDxSeattle talk on "The Age of the Artist Entrepreneur." He is also on the board of trustees for Artist Trust.

Dr. Quinton Morris is a native of Renton, Washington. He earned his Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of Texas at Austin. He joined the faculty of Seattle University in 2007 as Director of Chamber and Instrumental Music and Associate Professor of Violin and Chamber Music. He is the first tenured music professor at Seattle University in 30 years and the second living African-American violinist in United States history to receive such a distinction.
