

She is a founding member and lives at the Capitol Hill Urban Cohousing project with her husband and daughter. Grace is a founding partner of Schemata Workshop, an architecture and urban design practice based in Seattle with a keen focus on building community and social equity. Her firm works on projects that shape Seattle and guide its growth – such as Sound Transit stations, student housing in the University District, affordable housing and Transit Oriented Development on Capitol Hill, and neighborhood design guidelines for the Central Area.

She brings innovative ideas to her projects that merge client goals and sustainability measures – including urban agriculture, modular construction, and a strong focus on building community.

Grace is also the founder of Capitol Hill Urban Cohousing, a collaborative residential community which includes her street level office and a rooftop urban farm. She walks the talk of sustainability - leaving a small ecological footprint while incorporating holistic ideals of social and economic resilience into her daily life.

She is currently the Chair of the Seattle Planning Commission, and serves on the boards of the Capitol Hill Chamber of Commerce, the Housing Development Consortium of Seattle and King County, and the WSU Architecture Advisory Board.

In 2016 Schemata Workshop was recognized by King County Executive Dow Constantine as the Small Minority Owned Business of the Year due to their commitment to workplace equity. Schemata Workshop is a JUST organization - a label certification of corporate transparency by the International Living Futures Institute.
