Subject: CB 118943 – Social Service Navigators Proviso Lift

This memo concerns a proviso on a \$475,000 appropriation of General Subfund held in Finance General for the Human Services Department (HSD). This memo (1) summarizes the proviso and HSD's response and (2) offers options for the Committee's consideration.

Background

Green Sheet 265-1-B-2 appropriated \$475,000 in 2017 and endorsed appropriation of \$475,000 in 2018 of General Subfund to reserves in Finance General for HSD to design and implement a new social service navigator program at food banks. Food banks, as community resources frequented by low-income and diverse households with sundry needs, may have clients who can benefit from information and referral services. Such services could involve mental health, housing, homelessness, employment, and transportation programs.

Green Sheet 265-1-B-2 imposed a proviso requiring HSD to provide City Council with a report describing the following:

- 1. All work and funding contracted for or conducted by the City that achieves the same outcomes;
- 2. How social service navigators fit into the City's existing portfolio of services;
- 3. How duplication of existing services will be prevented;
- 4. The plan for effectively achieving outcomes; and
- 5. How evaluation of these new services will be conducted.

Discussion

HSD intends to issue a Request-for-Qualifications (RFQ) for the social service navigator program. Specific details of the RFQ, such as application criteria, will not be shared prior to its official release (which will be April 18, if Council lifts the proviso on April 17). HSD in its proviso response outlines broadly how it will address service duplication, integrate the new program into its existing service framework, and develop trackable reporting requirements for future evaluation.

HSD is currently funding 14 different programs that involve information and referral activities with approximately \$15.8 million (2017). The programs' performance measures relate to their target populations. Crisis Clinic, for example, measures the number of individuals who are stabilized and can seek additional resources, while the Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Legal Navigators program keeps track of the number of adult survivors who obtain legal assistance. It is unclear exactly which specific service areas will be needed by food bank clientele; trends in needed service areas will not be known until after the program is implemented.

HSD's plan for achieving outcomes will involve extensive initial training of grantees in use of a new database, reporting, technical support, and regular meetings. Performance evaluation will be based on the <u>results based accountability framework</u> that is applied to other HSD grant programs.

If the Council lifts the proviso, Central Staff recommends that the Human Services and Public Health Committee request HSD to provide a report during the first quarter of 2018 to report on the program's progress. The report would include the following information: most common information and referral service areas, to see whether trends for particular focus areas emerge, and demographic information of people served.

Also, if the Council lifts the proviso on April 17, 2017, contracts will begin in September 2017. HSD anticipates 2017 program costs to total \$355,000. The remaining \$120,000 appropriated to Finance General can be appropriated to another purpose.

Options

- A. Pass Council Bill 118943 (original, version D1b). This will lift the proviso and appropriate \$475,000 to HSD's Youth and Family Empowerment (YFE) Budget Control Level.
- B. Pass Council Bill 118943 substitution (Attachment A, version D2). This will lift the proviso. Major differences from the original bill include:
 - a. Revised language from the Law Department in Section 1 describing the proviso lift;
 - b. Amount appropriated from Finance General to HSD's YFE Budget Control Level changed from \$475,000 to \$355,000 in Sections 2 and 3; and
 - c. Adding a new Section 4 indicating the Council's intent to appropriate the remaining \$120,000 appropriated to Finance General for a purpose thematically consistent with the work program of the Human Services and Public Health Committee.
- C. Do not lift the proviso. If the Council does not lift the proviso, the RFQ will be delayed and the program could begin, at the earliest, in October 2017. A later start date will presumably lower program expenditures for 2017 and provide an opportunity for additional appropriations for other purposes.
