1. BILL SUMMARY

Legislation Title: AN ORDINANCE relating to the Seattle Department of Parks and Recreation; authorizing the Superintendent to amend the existing Operation and Maintenance Agreement between the Seattle Department of Parks and Recreation and the Seattle Art Museum concerning their roles in operation and maintenance of portions of Alaskan Way Boulevard and Myrtle Edwards Park that are operated as part of the Olympic Sculpture Park.

Summary and background of the Legislation:

This amendment extends the term during which the Seattle Art Museum (SAM) shall be responsible for routine maintenance of the upland vegetation and intertidal plantings in the newly created beach area in Myrtle Edwards Park, allowing SAM to continue its maintenance and planting responsibility for automatic successive one year periods beginning on the expiration date of the initial three year term specified in the 2006 Agreement, and not to exceed the remainder of the twenty-five year term of the 2006 SAM Agreement.

In addition, this legislation provides SAM the right to enforce rules governing public conduct on the Boulevard to the embayment area. These rules shall be the same as those applicable to any other City park as defined within Chapter 18.12, the Park Code, Seattle Municipal Code. These are rules and regulations currently applied in the OSP, and, in addition to the City's enforcement, SAM shall have the right to enforce these rules in the embayment area.

<u>Appropriations Notes</u>: SPR does not currently do this work, but \$2,000 will be an on-going expense and included in the next new facility cost budget issue paper if the legislation is approved.
